Background

- Local “Capacity” involves:
 - Community-level attributes (e.g., resources and readiness)
 - Attributes of the community grantee organization
- Purpose of assessing organizational capacity is to:
 - Identify capacity-building needs
 - Monitor progress in building capacity

Assessment Procedure

- 1) Capacity assessment tool to be completed by:
 - coalition/organization coordinator or director
 - coalition members (either all or a sample)
- 2) Forms collected and reviewed by coalition coordinator or local evaluator
- 3) Copies submitted to PIRE for further analysis and generation of community-level reports
